
Connecting refugees and asylum seekers in need with welcoming hosts

Refugees at Home is a small charity that arranges altruistic hosting, over a limited period, for asylum-seekers and refugees in need. Since we started, over six years ago, we have hosted nearly 185,000 individual person nights and been responsible for placing over 2300 guests across the UK.


This report is to tell you a little more about our impact – who we have helped in over six years and what we have done to help them.

Lockdown since March 2020 means that the total number of nights hosted has grown slowly over the last year: we think it's astonishing they have grown at all but it's largely down to some placements lasting very much longer than expected and a number of emergency placements too. 120 hosts stepped away because of Covid-19 but we are beginning to welcome them back to hosting.






Age Groups, 2020 - 2021




The age of guests remains steady. This doesn't include babies and children hosted with their parents. Our youngest guest this year was 19 years old, the oldest was 60. The oldest ever was 86 years old.




Gender Group, 2020 - 2021



The gender split reflects that of the refugee population in the UK. We have recently seen the number of transgender guests increase markedly. We are working with a growing number of LGBT+ referrers.



You can see lockdown reflected in our referrals: referrers trying to get many in under the wire last February and then months with almost none, and again for the second lockdown.



London is more dominant as a placement destination this year as more cities' referrers closed during lockdown. We are working on building hosting in cities across the UK from Belfast and Liverpool to Glasgow, Manchester and Sheffield.
